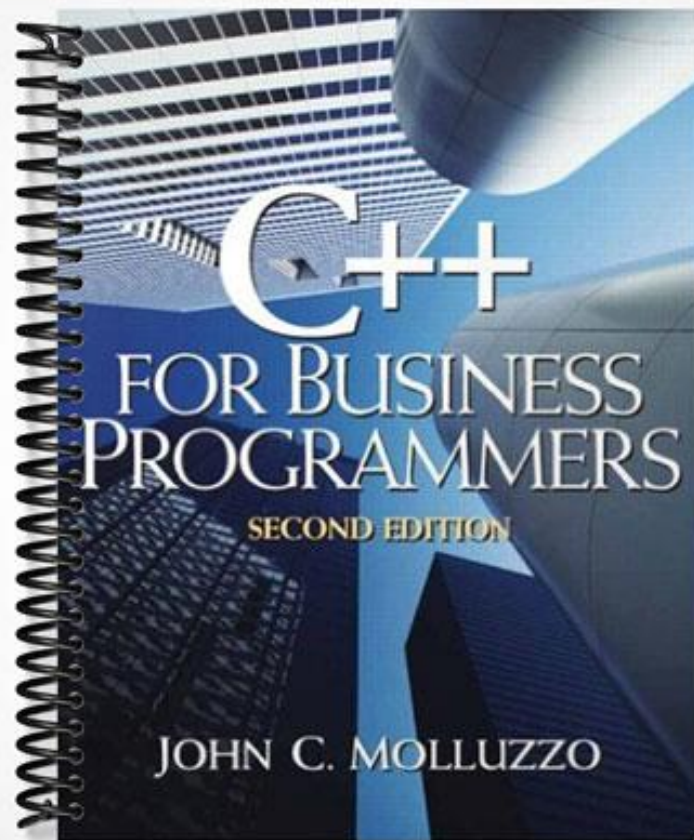

1. The second line of the comment does not begin with `//`. A comment extend from `//` to the end of the line.
2. The `>>` should be `<<` and the string should end with `"`. Also there is no `n` after the `\` inside the string. The statement should be

```
cout << "\nMy name is Maria";
```

3. Most compilers will issue an error message because the string is divided across two lines. That `cout` should read.

```
cout << "\nIs there "  
      << "something wrong ";
```
