





### **ESSAY**

1. What is an IP address? How does it differ from a domain name? Explain the similarities and differences, and give examples of sample IP addresses and domain names.

ANS:

To make a Web site accessible over the Internet, you must publish it to a Web server with a permanent IP address. An IP address is an assigned series of numbers, separated by periods, that designate an address on the Internet. To access a Web page, you can enter either an IP address or a domain name in the address box of your browser window. A domain name is expressed in letters instead of numbers, and it usually reflects the name of the business represented by the Web site. An example would be the Adobe Web site. The domain name is www.adobe.com, but the IP address would read something like 192.150.18.200. Because domain names use descriptive text instead of numbers, they are much easier to remember.

2. Explain what you must keep in mind when you choose filenames.

### ANS:

When you name a file, you should use a descriptive name that reflects the file's contents. For example, if the page is about a company's products, you could name it "products." You also must follow some general rules for naming Web pages. For example, the home page should be named "index.html" or "default.html." You can also use the file extension "htm" instead of "html." Do not use spaces, special characters, regular or back slashes, or punctuation in Web page filenames or in the names of any images that will be inserted in your Web site. Another rule is not to use a number for the first character of a filename. To ensure that everything loads properly on all platforms, including UNIX, assume that filenames are case sensitive and use lowercase characters. A good practice is to limit file names to eight characters.


3. Why does design matter in the development of a Web site? For example, why is making a good first impression important?

### ANS:

Since the home page is the first page users see as they enter a Web site, it is important to make a good first impression. When you enter a store, you immediately notice the way the merchandise is displayed, whether the staff is accessible and friendly, and the general overall appearance and comfort of the interior. The same is true of a Web site. If you see pleasing colors and images, friendly and easy-to-understand text, and a simple navigation system, you are favorably impressed and want to explore the site. If you see poorly organized content, misspelled words, and confusing navigation, you will probably leave the site. It is much faster and easier to leave a Web site than to leave a store, so you have less time to correct a bad first impression. Have others evaluate your home page before you finalize it so you understand how others see your page.
