

1. Please describe bitmap and vector images. Which one is more popular?

ANS:

- <u>Vector images</u> are composed of key points and paths, which define shapes and coloring instructions, such as line and fill colors. The vector file contains a description of the image expressed mathematically. The file describes the image to the computer, and the computer draws it. One of the benefits of vector images is the small file size, particularly relative to the larger file size of bitmap images.
- <u>Bitmap images</u> map out or plot an image on a pixel-by-pixel basis. A pixel, or picture element, is the smallest point in a graphical image. Graphic monitors display images by dividing the display screen into thousands (or millions) of pixels, arranged in a grid of rows and columns. The pixels appear connected because they are so close together. This grid of pixels is a bitmap.
- Bitmap images are the more common type of image file.

Link (the link has not been clicked), Active Link (the link changes color when the user clicks it), and Visited Link (the link has been visited).

b) Default colors:

The default color for a link is blue and a visited link is purple.

c) How to change colors:

You easily can change colors of links through the Page Properties dialog box.

3. Three types of link paths are available: absolute, relative, and root-relative. Please briefly describe each of these paths.

ANS:

- An <u>absolute link</u> provides the complete URL of the document. This type of link also is referred to as an external link. Absolute links generally contain a protocol (such as http://) and primarily are used to link to documents on other servers.

- You use <u>relative links</u> for local links. This type of link also is referred to as a document-relative link, or an internal link. If the linked documents are in the same folder, such as those in your parks folder, this is the best type of link to use. You also can use a relative link to link to a document in another folder, such as the images folder.
- You use the <u>root-relative link</u> primarily when working with a large Web site that requires several servers. Web developers generally use this type of link when they must move HTML files from one folder or server to another folder or server.
