

1. Explain how filtering decisions are made in a stateful inspection firewall.

A stateful inspection firewall monitors the state of the connection and compiles the information in a state table. Because of this, filtering decisions are based on the context that has been established by prior packets that have passed through the firewall.

A compound document is also an application environment containing program objects that can be interlinked and interacted with by a user. Compound documents are developed from information parts that originate from different applications and are assembled on-the-fly.
